TORONTO, March 17.—In a simple but honored grave in Villers station military cemetery, lie the remains of Lieut. L. G. Hutton of Windsor, Ont., a gold medalist and graduate of Victoria College and a prospective professor of his alma mater.

A photograph of the young hero's last resting place was shown by J. H. Rodd of Windsor to Mr. Justice Middleton at Osgoode Hall today, when the student soldier was declared to be dead, and certain clauses in the will of his mother, Mrs. Agnes a.A. Hutton, were regarded as null and void.

Mrs. Hutton made several wills. In an early one the gifted son was named as a very material beneficiary. In a later one, after he had been reported killed a provision was made for the removal of the body from his war grave to the family burial place in Windsor. The sorrowing mother saw hope receding, but it never vanished from her heart while she lived.

To a thousand dollars for a Lincoln G. Hutton scholarship at Victoria she added another thousand in her will, besides giving \$500 to the Hospital for Sick Children, Toronto, and \$2,000 to establish a soldiers' home.

Today Mr. Rodd made it quite clear that the body could not be brought to Canada, as the French Government would not consent.




