"It seems impossible that it is twenty-five years since I have been there," was the Pope's exclamation as he looked from a window of his apartments this morning into the sunlit piazza of St. Peter's. This was the Pontiff's only reference to his long term of self-imposed imprisonment in the Vatican, during which he has never gone beyond the palace grounds and St. Peter's, which is onsidered to be part of the Vatican. "What a glorious morning for the Jubilee of my Pontificate," the Pope added as he proceeded with evident easure to peruse the almost innumerable telegrams, letters and ad-dresses of congratulation which have d the Vatican from all parts


