FRASER, DUNCAN CAMERON. (*Guysborough.*)

Grand parents came from Inverness, Scot. B. in the Co. of Pictou, N.S., 1st Oct., 1845. Ed. at Dalhousie Coll., Halifax, where he graduated in 1872. M., 24 Oct., 1878, Bessie G., dau. of William Graham, of New Glasgow. Admitted as a solicitor, 1873. Has been several times Presdt. of the Alumni of Dalhousie Coll., and has been twice Mayor of New Glasgow. Was a mem. of the Legislative Council N.S. and of the Hill Administration in 1878; resigned same year; re-appointed to Leg. Council and was mem. of the Executive Council without portfolio and leader for the Government in the Leg. Council, N.S. from 1887 to 1891, when he resigned and was elected for present seat in the Commons. A Liberal.—*New Glasgow, N.S.*

FRÉCHETTE, LOUIS ISRAEL, CÔTÉ *alias*, J.P. (*Megantic.*)

Descended from an old French family, early settlers in the country. B. at St. Ferdinand in 1848. Ed. at the elementary schools. M., Miss Léda Bernier. A merchant. Has been Postmaster and Mayor of St. Ferdinand. Elected to the Commons at g.e. 1882, but subsequently unseated, April, 1884. Re-elected at last g.e. A Conservative.—*St. Ferdinand d'Halifax, P.Q.*

FRÉMONT, JULES-JOSEPH TASCHEREAU, D.C.L. (*Quebec County.*)

Descended from an ancient Norman family which came to Canada during the French *regime*. S. of the late Charles Frémont, M.D., Chevalier de Saint Grégoire le Grand, for many years the head of the medical faculty of Laval Univ. B. at Quebec, 20 Dec., 1855. Ed. at St. Mary's College Montreal and at Laval Univ. M., 1 June, 1881, Alix, dau. of the late Hon. J. O. Beaubien, ex-member Leg. Council, Quebec. Called to the Bar, P.Q., 1878. Is Professor of Civil Law in Laval Univ., and Mayor of the City of Quebec.
