you, so for the purpose of obtaining your advice and assistance in all weighty and arduous affairs which may the State and Defence of Our Dominion of Canada concern, We have thought fit to summon you to the Senate of Our said Dominion, and We do appoint you for the Staducons Electoral Division of Our Province of Quebee, and We do command you, the said Pievrs Baillargeon, that all difficulties and excuses whatsoever hying aside, you be and appear for the purposes aforesaid in the Senate of Our said Dominion at all times whenseever and whereacever. Our Parliament may be in Our said Dominion convoked and holden; and this you are in no wise to omit.

IN TESTINGST WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Scal of Canada to be hereunto affixed : WITNESS, Our Right Trusty and Well-Beloved Cousin and Councillor the Right Honorable Eir FREDEECK TEMPLE, Earl of Dufferin, Viscount and Earon Clandeboye, of Clandeboye, in the County Down, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom, Baron Dufferin and Clandeboye of Ballyleidy and Kulleleagh, in the County Down, in the Peerage of Ireland, and a Baronet, Knight of Our Most Illustrious Order of Saint Pawick, and Knight Commander of Our Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Government House, in Our City of Ottawa, in Our Dominion of Canada, this Twenty seventh day of March, in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy-four, and in the Thirty-seventh Year of Our Reign.
