The Inspector from Missouri reported to the Commission on the following year that there was very little known of the Sweeney system in this State, two years later one of the inspectors from Ohio stated that the Sweeney system had crowded itself into the larger cities of that state, that there was considerable of it in Cleveland and that he was informed it had been engaged in much more extensive work in Cincinnati, but there was evidently something of exaggeration in his remarks for another member of the Commission stated that had been a resident and workman for many years in that city, the largest in the state, and if such things were they had not come under his observation.
