- 8. Passed the Employment Service Act whereby during the first 2 years of its operation over a million workers were placed in employment without cost.
- 9. Passed the Technical Education Act, appropriating one million dollars per year for 10 years to aid in the promotion and advancement of technical education.
- 10. Appointed a commission on industrial relations giving labor 2 representatives thereon.
- 11. Convened 200 delegates equally representing employers and workmen, at a conference to consider and deal with the report of the Commission on Industrial Relations.

to the Prime Minister

- ted, on the nomination of the Trades Congress of Canada, a representative of labor as his advisor at the peace conference.
- 13. The Prime Minister of Canada was largely responsible for the inclusion of the Labor Convention in the Peace Treaty.
- 14. Labor given a representative on the Board of Commerce.
- 15. Given a representative on the Board of Railway Commissioners.
- 16. Granted substantial gratuities to returned men to aid them in re-establishing themselves in civil life.
- 17. Inaugurated a policy of unemployment relief which
 formerly had never been
 recognized or accepted as a
 federal responsibility and
 disposed in this connection
 of several millions of dollars
 with a wallwhich it is difficult to

estimate when measured in human offer, especially needy women and children.

The Maxxima promised immediate and drastic action with respect to profiteering has had no perceptible results.

The returned soldiers have been informed that no further cash grants can be given.

The employment relief incurred by the preceding government has been abandoned. The employment service branch of the Department of Labor has been substantially curtailed, and its efficiency seriously affected.

The attitude of the present Government during its two years in office has not been one of conspicuous friendship for, or consideration of, the needs of Canada's wage earners.
