THE ELIBANK INCIDENT

Canada, the Minister said, was no longer a colony and was well equipped to arrive at her own conclusions with respect to all matters of government.

Lord Elibank, the Minister said, was a great personal friend, but as Defence Minister he could not fail to take exception to the statements attributed to him in his Toronto speech.
