an Order in Council of 18th instant you have been appointed to succeed Mr. C. E. E. Parke as Indian Agent for the Chippense of Cape Graker, with selary at the same rate, namely, \$800 a year, and with the magisterial jurisdiction prescribed by the idlet section of the Indian Act over the counties of Gray and Bruce.

A house is provided for the use of the Indian Agent on the reserve, and, as required by the above mentioned Order in Council, it is necessary for you to take up your residence there. You will be expected to do so as soon as possible.

I would call your attention to the following general instructions as to your duties,

The suppression of vice of all kinds and of the liquer traffic among the Indians is an important duty of an Indian Agent. Under the prosvisions of section 181, above mentioned, of the Indian Act, you are ex-officion justice of the peace and have the years and authority of two justices of the peace in the district above referred to (counties of
