

Ottawa, 3rd March, 1915

Sir,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 26th ultimo, on behalf of Daniel Paul, an Indian Policeman, with respect to moiety of fines to which Paul claims he is entitled.

In reply I beg to say that the Department will be glad to have a list of the cases with the date of trial in which fines were collected by the police magistrate at Newcastle on informations laid by your client.

There does not appear to have been any Order-in-Council under Section 150 of the Indian Act as referred to by you but even if there was such an Order-in-Council it would not effect your client's right to his moiety of fines under Sections 135, 139 and 150 as referred to by you.
