With reference to Superintendent Smith's letter of 27th September in regard to a fine of \$50.00 and costs which was imposed upon W.E.Martin of the Six Nations Reserve who was convicted in Caledonia for having procured liquor; I beg to point out that notwithstanding the fact that a letter has reached the Department from the Brantford Indian Office, and also from Mr. WanLoon, Indian Agent at Hagersville in regard to this case, the fine imposed has not reached the Department. If the money was received by Superintendent Smith, it should be for warded to the Department at once, or a report should be made stating to whom the money was paid. I may say that Mr. VanLoon is being written to in this matter today, Fyle No. 254,009-16A.
