PERMIT TO OCCUPY

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Permission is hereby given to KEYSTONE SHINGLES & LUMBER LTD. of the City of New Westminster, Province of British Columbia, to use and occupy that certain portion of Gleyka Indian Reserve No. 6, in the Coast District of the Province of British Columbia, as shown on sketch or plan of the same on file in the office of the Indian Affairs Branch, Department of Mines and Resources, as a road right of way for the removal of saw-logs across the reserve to the booming-grounds at the shore of Actaeon Sound, for a period of five years dating from November 1st, 1941, and subject to the following conditions:-

1. That an annual rental of \$120.00 will be paid on the first day of November for each and every year that this Permit is in force. The payment of the first year's rental is hereby acknowledged.
2. That such lands shall not be used for any other purpose than that above stated.
3. That no place for trading with the Indians or other persons will be established on the property by the Company, nor will the Company permit any others to do such trading.
4. That no intoxicating liquors of any kind whatsoever will be permitted by the Company to be brought into any of their buildings or camps, or onto the reserve by any member of the Company or its employees.
5. That the Company will not cut timber on the reserve without proper authorization from the Department through the Indian Agent, and that no timber cut by Indians on the reserve will be purchased by the Company unless the Indian offering it for sale is in possession of an official Permit to cut such timber.
6. That the Company will pay all rents and dues direct to the Department through the office of the Indian Agent.
7. That in all respects the Company will be guided by the provisions of the Indian Act and timber regulations.
