Misses E.M. Middleton and M. P. Oakes being entered as Paymaster Sub Lieutenants on the 2nd October and 27th December respectively. Both of these officers have had extensive experience in cookery teaching.

40. Pay

A considerable portion of the work carried out in this Directorate is devoted to ascertaining that the new Dependents' Allowance procedure is being correctly carried out. Considerable improvement has been noted in this direction but efforts to keep pace of the volume of work are somewhat handicapped by the lack of suitable civilian staff.
