

Enterprise witnessed the largest crowd ever congregated in the village when the whole countryside turned out to hear Hon. Mackenzie King speak on behalf of Mr. Colin Campbell, Liberal candidate. Cars were parked a mile out on every road leading into the village and there were five times as many people outside as the hall would hold, who heard the addresses from a loud speaker. So great was the crowd that some of the speakers had to enter the building through a window in order to reach the platform.

Mr. King was tendered a magnificant ovation. He was supported on the platform by Premier Gardiner of Saskatchewan; Joseph Haycock, former Patron Leader; Hon. Nelson Parliament; William A. Fraser, M.P. for Northumberland; and Colin Campbell, the Liberal candidate for the House of Commons in Frontenac-Addington. G. Anson Aylesworth, of Newburgh, a brother of Sir Allan Aylesworth, presided.

The Liberal Leader delivered a devastating attack on the Government, concentrating particularly on the trade and tariff policies, which he maintained were strangling Canada. The only way Canada could hope to prosper was by selling her wheat, lumber, fruit and manufactured goods abroad as well as in the home market.

He urged the people to express disapproval of Bennett Government policies in the by-elections and thus make it impossible for the administration longer to cling to office.
