Attached herewith in duplicate please find a resolution from the Scowlitz Band under date of October 23rd wherein the Council of the Scowlitz Band agree that the house which was built in 1950 for Clarence Williams be leased for an indefinite period to Donald Felix Joe of the Chehalis Band at a rental of \$10.00 per month.

Clarence Williams occupied this house for a very short time only and became separated from his wife the same year the house was built, consequently, the house has not been made use of since that date. The Band feel that inasmuch as Donald Felix Joe wishes to lease it, the revenue derived therefrom can be placed in their Band Funds and at the same time keep the house in a liveable condition as if left unoccupied it would soon fall into disrepair.

It is recommended that a permit be granted at the Pleasure of the Department in the name of Donald Felix Joe, at a rate of \$10.00 rental, payable monthly in advance, to date from October 11, 1954.
