

(b) The Board is opposed to the establishment of new private stations in areas already covered by existing stations, nevertheless, exception may be made in cases where existing stations are found to give inadequate or unsatisfactory service in the local area.

2. TELEVISION STATIONS

The Board is not opposed to the establishment and operation of private television stations for experimental purposes only, provided that licenses for such stations are restricted to those fully qualified technically and financially, and that the licenses shall be subject to such terms of expropriation as the Board may deem advisable.

3. SHORT WAVE BROADCASTING STATIONS

The Board is opposed to the establishment of new private short wave broadcasting stations or increases in power in existing stations. Such licenses as are renewed for existing stations of this class should bear an appropriate expropriation clause.

4. ULTRA SHORT WAVE BROADCASTING STATIONS

The Board is not opposed to the issue of licenses for ultra short wave broadcasting stations for experimental purposes only, provided all possible reservations are made for use of Corporation stations.

5. SHORT WAVE "BROADCAST PICK-UP" STATIONS

The Board is not opposed to the issue of licenses for short wave "broadcast pick-up" stations for use where wire lines are not available or where circumstances are such that the same may not be readily employed.

6. INCREASES IN POWER FOR EXISTING PRIVATE STATIONS

The Board favors the increases in power of existing small stations up to the maximum of 1000 watts where such can be accommodated, and there are no technical objections.

THAT in every case a recommendation shall be made for consideration of the Board of Governors for final decision and recommendation to the Minister of Transport.
