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EXTRACTS FROM ANNUAL REPORT.

Another year in the history of our Convention has run its round and its work has come to a close. We cannot return to make amends for what has been omitted or done amiss. Whether we have been faithful or unfaithful, we must pass on to the great reckoning day.

THE EXTENT OF THE FIELD.

The field keeps continually enlarging. Our actual operations extend now from a point 10 miles east of Emerson to the Sturgeon River, 15 miles north of Edmonton, a distance of 1,123 miles. Besides this, we work on nearly 1,000 miles of branch lines. There are other lines open that we have not yet touched, besides large country districts where they are calling loudly for the Gospel.
