Grain, Flour and Bread Stuffs of all kinds, Animals of all kinds Fresh, Smoked and Salted Meats. Cotton Wool, Seeds and Vegetables, Undried Fruits, Dried Fruits, Fish of all kinds, Products of Fish and all other Creatures living in the Water, Poultry, Eggs, Hides, Furs, Skins or Tails, undressed, Stone or Marble in its crude or unwrought state Slate, Butter, Cheese, Tallow, Lard, Horns, Manures, Ores of Metals of all kinds. Coal, Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Ashes. Timber and Lumber of all kinds, round, hewed, and sawed, unmanufactured in whole or in part, Firewood, Plants, Shrubs and Trees, Pelts, Wool, Fish Oil. Rice, Broom Corn and Bark, Gypsum, ground or unground, Hewn or wrought or unwrought Burr or Grindstones Dye Stuffs Flax, Hemp and Tow, unmanufactured Unmanufactured Tobacco Rags ; so long as the said Treaty between Great Britain and the United States of America, in the said recited Act mentioned, shall remain in force in this Island.

IV .- The following Articles shall be admitted into this Island and its Dependencies Certain products of the free of Duty, being the growth, produce or manufacture of the United Kingdom, or of the British North American Provinces, or of the Island of Prince Edward, respectively, notwithstanding any Law to the contrary, viz :
