To think otherwise is to reverse the teaching of common sense and experience. Every man has a right to belong to a labor union, or to remain out of it, or to leave one that he has joined. Every efficient worker has entitles him and his family at least to the blessing of life, health and liberty. A failure to accept these through trying experiences before these propositions will be accepted in theory and practice.
