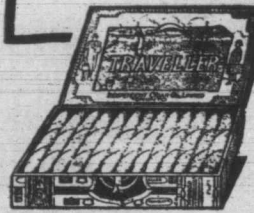

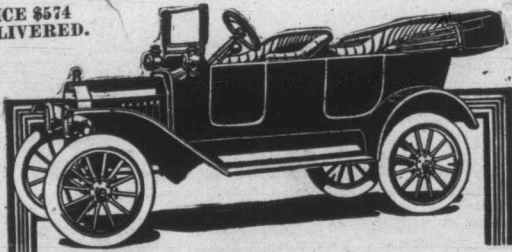

GREAT ARMIES IN EAST

Russians have nearly 3,000,000 men, and enemy 1,500,000

New York, July 27—A dispatch from Lausanne, Switzerland, says:

Carefully sifted information today shows that the Germans have, on the eastern front, about 900,000 men, and Austrians 800,000, of whom they are said already to have lost some 300,000.

The total of the Russian forces under the command of General Kurapatkin and General Brussiloff equals 137 divisions of infantry and 36 divisions of cavalry, or 2,740,000 bayonets and 162,000 sabres, or a total of 2,902,000 men. General Brussiloff's army, alone, equals 175,000 men.
