Paris, May 11,—When the Court of Arbitration on the seal question resumed its sittings yesterday. Sir Charles Russell, in opening, recited the points of difference, defined international law and reminded the tribunal that its duty was not to make additional laws but to apply those laws now existing to the case before it. He denied the alleged property right as claimed by the United States. On being interrupted by Mr. Morgan, counsel for the United States, Sir Charles explained that while Great Britain frequently claimed jurisdiction over the high seas, she never yet claimed the property right of sea products.

Paris, May 12.—Sir Charles Russell continued his speech before the Behring sea tribunal yesterday, calling attention to the inconsistency of the American claim of the right of protection to seals wherever found, in view of the fact that no seizures were attempted outside of Behring sea, Sir Charles defended the British commissioners against the charge of partiality in justifying polagie sea.
