APPLE SHIPMENT.—From Oct 1, 1885, to April 30, 1886, there was shipped to London from the different stations on the W. & A. R'y., via Richmond, 38,606 barrels and 25 boxes, made up as follows: Newport 266 barrels, Windsor 105, Falmouth 533, Grand Pre 423, Wolfville 1076, Port Williams 528, Kentville 2630, Cokilbrook 349, Cambridge 2036, Waterville 731, Berwick, 2170, Aylesford 2423, Kingston 2201, Wilnot 1576, Middleton 3287, Lawrenceston 1191, Paradise 4179, Bridgetown 3723 bbls and 25 boxes, Roundhill 2394, Tupperville 168, Annapolis 1219. The largest shipment for any one month was for October in which 9245 1/2 barrels were shipped from the different stations. These are from Richmond only, and do not include shipments from Annapolis. The quantity shipped the previous season was upwards of 70,000 barrels.
