signed on the 8th of the present month. Hoedel's age was twenty-one. Hoedel, when informed that his execution was fixed upon, became deathly pale. He wished to plead for pardon, but soon recovered his composure when told this was useless. He asked for wine for supper, and drank to the Commune and the leader of the Social Democracy. When his sen-tence was read on the scalfold he spat disdainfully, and cried "Bravo." He re-pulsed the ministrations of a chaplain, declaring them useless, as it would take years to convert him. Fifty persons, including officials, judges, police, and twelve citizens, attended the execution, which is generally approved. Official notice of the execution had been posted throughout the city as a warning. It required but a single stroke of the axe to decapitate Hoedel. The re-mains were immediately buried.
