Synopsis of Canadian Northwest

Land Regulations.

Any person who is the sole head of a tamily, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties: Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homest ad on a farm of at least 80 acres solely own ed and occupied by hum or by his father, mother, sen, dauger, orother or sister.

It is not the intention of the syndicate to compete with the raisers of this country or in Canada. They do not expect England or Germany to grant them any abatement of the quarantine regulations against South American cattle, but extensive pre-parations are under way for the es-ablishment of plants for the ship-ment of chilled beef to Europe, where the exactions of the American mea-

trust are exisperating the purchasers. The headquarters of the company will probably be in Sac Paulo, and the principal port of shipment, San-tes, 250 miles from Buenos Ayr's, the shipping point for Argentine beef.
