#### Synopsis et Canadian North West Land Regulations

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war, and who has since continued to be a British subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead a quarter section of available Deminion Land i Manijoba, Saskatchewan or Ather Applicant must appear in person a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agence for District. Entry by proxy may t made on certain conditions Six months residence upon and cultiva tion of land in each of three years.

In certain districts a homesteade may secure an adjoining quarter-section as pre-emption. Price \$3.00 per acre Duties-Reside six months in each of three years after earning homestead datent and cultivate 50 acres extra. May obtain pre-emption patent as soo as bomestead patent on certain con A settler after obtaining homeste

patent, if he cannot secure a pre-emp ion, may take a purchased homester in certain districts. Price \$3.00 pe acre. Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

Holders of entries may count time o employment as farm labourers in Canads during 1917, as residence dutie under certain conditions.

When Dominion Lands are adver tised or posted for entry, returned solderis who have served overseas and have been bonourably discharged, reesive one day priority in applying for entry at local Agent's Office (but not be presented to Agent.
