## Tides and Currents of Quidi Vidi.

There are a number of things about Quidi Vidi Lake so thick some of the old men, who took an interest in regattas in the past to which I give attention. There is a current setting down the north side with a large draft into the outlet at the foot of the north side. There is a cross current over this at Power's River inflow which takes somewhat from the speed of a boat at that crossing point going and coming. There is a back sweep of tide at the foot of the lake going south across the lake and sweeping up on the north side of the pond to the Penitentiary. There is shoaler water on the north side of the pond, and deeper on the south. It is easier to run in shallow water than in deep, for there is less of the natural viscosity of the water to overcome. Those things were well known to some of our old men, of the past who took a deep interest in the races. Let me mention the names of some of those old men: John Gailishaw, Thomas Ryan and Wm. Vinnicombe, master pilot, and Mr. Thomas Ryan, tailor, and Mr. Martin Roache, Outer Cove, Coxswain. All these old sportsmen in rowing matters took a keen interest in these matters and watched the rainfall in the lake, the intake and outflow of water and figured out their results accordingly. If you take chips and go over Quidi Vidi and drop them in the water you will then begin to know the value of these observations. Do it for experiment sake on a calm evening and you will be surprised to behold the tidal movements of that chip. The anglers who fish those beautiful waters to-day, know something of these strange tide movements. Wm. Vinnicombe, Jr., master pilot, who is a keen angler, can tell some things about the movements of a float with a worm attached to it in different parts of the lake. With water moving with you in a fast boat, you can take a better hold of it, with water going from you you get a weaker hold. I mention those things because next to balancing a crew in a boat as to weight and strength, a thing that even coxswains of average skill can do, they are of the highest importance. As four of the boats this year are so evenly matched, the crews fairly equal in four of the races (in my opinion), I think there never was a year in the history of the regatta when the value of the man who will hold the tiller ropes was of more importance.

LONDON, July 29.

The refusal of the Dock workers to obey the manifesto issued by the strike leaders on Saturday declaring the strike at an end, was given effect to-day, when a very few men returned to work. A new spirit seems to have entered into the men to-day it was observed that most of them displayed a much more ugly temper than hitherto. The Secretary of the Strike Committee

said the strike would probably be resumed. Several of the unions involved met to-day to discuss the situation. The stevedores' union, with a membership of eight thousand men in London, decided to-day to instruct its members to return to work.

MANY TRAPS DAMAGED.—Passengers by the S. S. Fogota say that the recent heavy storm which had swept along the coast from Bay de Verde down to Twillingate, all the traps that were out in Friday's storm were badly torn. In one or two instances twine was completely lost and several have been so cut up that by the time their owners have them repaired the trap season will be over. It will be a great loss to the people in several places where cod is plentiful.
