



Germany's Great Need is Leather.

Baltimore, July 16. Germany shows exactly one sign of weakening and no more, says Dr. Joseph S. Ames, professor of physics at Johns Hopkins University. He saw war activity for more than six weeks as a member of the National Research Council sent by the Government to make scientific observations to enable the United States to render the most efficient possible ervice to her allies in the conduct of

"The one sign of weakness," Dr. Ames added, "is shoe leather. I saw thousands of German prisoners while I was in France, and in none was there the slightest further sign of want or privation except shoes. They all wore shoes that were in bad shape, and that, you know, is an important sign, for a badly shod army is a half crippled army."
