Some of these quoted phrases tell very forcefully and appealingly what easily could be elaborated into several paragraphs.

They actually are elaborated-by the reader. The phrase is for him the starting point. He deduces and reasons. Take the statement, made of a car, "Never been off city streets." Five words but in the reader's mind forms a picture of an automobile which has been driven only on good roads, moderate grades. An auto mobile which has always been handy to garage and repair shop An automobile, perhaps, which has only been driven a few thousand miles. In all likelihood, a very desirable automobile to

own-at any rate, surely worth investigating. Those five words may, of themselves, be enough to make a

Want Ad produce a quick sale. Other selling arguments can be put, tellingly, in few words.

"Family car," "can't be told from new," "guaranteed mechanically," "quiet motor, beautiful body," "perfect running condition. 'all essentials guaranteed," "driven less than 6,000 miles," "over hauled and repainted, powerful motor," "original finish, in splendie condition," "motor the very best we have ever seen in an '18. 'was owned by a man who loved it," "has a long life ahead of it, "a car that you can be proud of," "owned by a very careful driver. "a real good car, at the price of the body alone," "looks like new, "upholstery like new." "has many extras," "purchased new in June," "has scarcely been driven at all," "let the best mechanic in town inspect this for you-he'll agree," "on small payments
