Federal Government Right to Control Navigable Waters

Asso tated Press Despate Washington, Dec. 11 .- The case of the Chicago sanitary district, involving the right of Chicago city to drain ten million cubic feet of water par second from Lake Michigan, is now in the hands of the supreme court. and no forecast as to a probable date for decision is available here. There is no rule as to the time consumed by the supreme court in consideration of any case, but it is expected a decision will be handed down this winter. Belief is expressed here that the federal government, which is seeking to prevent what it considers the excessive drainage of water, will be upheld by the court for the reason that a decision for Chicago would strike a blow at the right of the federal government to control navigable waters.


