Every one admits that the election held has been of great profit in many ways. It has clearly shown his Worship Mayor Andrew that he is backed by the solid ratepayers and the councillors have discovered that they also have the confidence of the electors.

We are firm believers in an election to awaken a larger interest in town affairs and have been complimented by all for the independent stand we have taken in our endeavor to promote the interests of the town.

#### CANNOT TELL THE TRUTH

In answering the Graphic's assertion that the Tribune farmed out the printing of the town Blue Book that paper says:

"So far as the farming out of the work is concerned The Tribune would say there is positively not one word of truth in it. It is not the custom of The Tribune to farm out work."

This is a deliberate falsehood. The Campbellton Blue Book was not printed in Campbellton, but as we stated last week the work was done in Fredrickton.

The Graphic again wishes to state that it has no fault to find with the Town Clerk for his part of the affair, and had the work been done here we would never have mentioned the matter.

The Tribune's statement that the Graphic sends quantities of its printing to St. John and Ottawa to be done are likewise not true. We buy our special rulings from either of these cities as occasion demands, but the printing is all done on our own premises. We have one of the best equipped printing plants in this province and a large and increasing list of satisfied customers is our best advertisement.

As to the assertion that the Tribune saved the town \$20.50 on the

printing of the Blue Book, this is not so. The work is done at a certain price per page, and some years the reports makes more pages than others, thus the price of the completed work varies.

#### SAWDUST

To save eighty-four c.n.s the printing of the town Blue Book was sent to Fredrickton and Campbellton citizens lost \$84.00.

### WINNING CANDIDATES REGARDING NOT ELECTED SCARLET FEVER

Returning Officer at Dalhousie Says Ballots Were Not According to Law

Important Notice From The Campbellton Board of Health —\$40.00 Penalty

Dalhousie, April 18—In our election for Mayor Mr. Thos. G. Scott, Engine Driver had 128 votes, W. S. Montgomery 123. Six Aldermen on Mr. Scott's ticket had the highest number of votes, Mr. A. Barberie leading. The returning officers ruled out ninety ballots for Mr. Scott for an alleged defect in the manner of printing. The Town of Newcastle is incorporated under the same act as Dalhousie and this form of ballot that this returning officer was persuaded to reject has been constantly used there in town elections for years.
