WINNIPEG, March 7 .- My last letter terminated with the arrival of the Great Vestern railway party at Chicago on March and. This city we left at 11.30, the reather delightful, the sun of summer brightness and warmth. A few hours risk riding brought us into the state of Wisconsin. Mr. J. J. Murphy, assistantsuperintendent of the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul railway, and A. J. Ealing, of the same railway, rode with us to Milwaukee, and proved excellent company, And now, seated in the cupola of the con ductor's car, we have a commanding view of the country. As we approach Milwaukee the land becomes higher, the little lakes dotted here and there begin to disappear, and the land has a more imposing aspect. There are very few trees in this part-those which do appear are principally ornamental and fruit trees around the farm houses. The soil is black and seems well adapted for cultivation.

THE POOR APPEARANCE of the farm houses is very striking in a country in which the soil is so fertile. Very unlike the farm houses in Ontario, whose owners seem to take pride in beautifying their places. The comfort of the lovers of the weed is well looked after on this line. The smoking car is well ventilated, with rattan seats and beautiful lamps. Milwaukee rerched at 2:30 p.m. Truly this place is

Tooker and Edward De la Hooke, the enterprising gentlemen charged by the Great Western to look after the party. Arrived at Osakis at 4 p.m. Friay, where the hungry, tired passengers partook of a substantial and delicious dinpartook of a substantial and delicious din-ner—in fact, it seems strange and almost incredible that such a luxurious dinner could be got up so far in the Northwest for 50 cents. Fergus Falls (which we reached at 7.30) has a population of 3500, and is at the junction of the Northern Pacific and St. P., M. and M. railways. The party had supper at Glynden. Between Fergus Falls and St. Vincent is one vast uncultivated prairie. Arrived at St. Vincent at 8.15 Saturday. Near here is Pembina, where are stationed 200 American soldiers for the purpose of quelling disturbances and pre-venting smuggling.
