Said the lamented McCheyne, "Some speculate on the dectrines of the Gospel, but say very little about the Gospel itself. I see a man cannot be a faithful minister, until he preaches Christ for Christ's sake."

And so is that the best teaching, not which most pleases the fancy or conforms to the caprice of men, but which furnishes the truest reflection of the heart. Louis XIV, of France, said one day to the famous Massillon, "I have heard many great orators in my chapel, and have always been satisfied with them; but every time I hear you, I am dissatisfied with myself."

LAUD AND LEIGHTON .- The first victim of Laud's severity was Dr. Leighton, who had been professor of moral philosophy in the University of Edinburgh, and was father of the archbishop of that name. He was brought before the Star Chamber for having written a book in which the occlosiastical administration was censured; and for this offence he was sentenced to be twice publicly whipped, to be set twice in the pillory, to have his nose slit, and his cars cut each time, to be branded in both cheeks, to be imprisoned for life, and to pay 4010,000 to the king. All this was faithfully executed, the fine probably excepted, and he was liberated, after cleven years' confinement, by the Long Patliament, in 1640, being then seventy-two years of age.
