per or iron pyrites losing much less than others. As much as 95 per cent. has been recovered, but generally the eslvage is between 70 and 85 per cent. Theoretically, the loss of silver should be confined to that in the pigment and that in the slags, i. e., in the former about 1 oz. and in the latter 12 cz., or 21 ozs. per ton of ore treated; but there is a variable loss somewhere between, which has never been discovered. (Later returns show the silver loss to be under 2 oz, per ton of ores treated, while there was a gain in the lead and gold over the asray of the raw ore)

The cost of tresting the ore at Canon City is from 85 to 810 (average cost, \$6), including the production of the pigment and matte. The price of elack coal delivered at the works is 50c. per ton, the coal mines being near the works. The price of coke is \$5 per ton at Canon City.

The cost of a plant to treat 250 tons of ore per day, producing about 20 tons of pigment and 40 tons of matte, is \$250,000.


