The Bank of Winnipeg is expected to commence active organization very shortly.

Mr. Van Bruyssel, a Belgian capitalist and street railway promoter, will place a street railway proposal before the Calgary City Council.

Much interest is being aroused in New York in the experiment which the American Bank Note Company is making in having installed in its new office building at Broad and Beaver Streets a dining room for its officers. The success of the arrangement is being closely watched, and if it proves practicable will undoubtedly lead to its adoption by other prominent corporations. The September number of the *Imp-rint*, which is issued by the company, contains photogravures of the new building and portraits of the principal officers, of which Mr. Warren L. Green is president.

Messrs. E. H. Gay and Company, of Boston, who had also an office in Montreal, have been petitioned into involuntary bankruptcy at the instance of three creditors whose claims amount to about \$3,600. In their action the three creditors assert that "the alleged acts of bankruptcy are that on August 8th the firm made a general assignment to John P. Reynolds, Jr., for the benefit of creditors, and that the concern conveyed and transferred to Reynolds the whole or part of the property with intent to hinder, delay and defraud." The Canadian business of the company was largely in government, municipal and railway bonds.
