

The jacket will be seen in No. 19 on the other side of Supplement.  
MATERIALS REQUIRED: 2 1/2 yards of matchless silk, 1 1/2 yards of pure silk.  
The bodice is suitable to be made in any dress material, and is the correct shape for this season.

No. 8 to 12.—LADIES' FLANNEL PETTICOAT WITH NEW BAND.  
The back and front of petticoat will be seen in Nos. 10 and 11 on the other side of Supplement. The shape is particularly adapted to the present style of dress, as the long band with white lace put over the bodice keeps the petticoat very smooth under the dress. The petticoat will be better made with a lace at the bottom for letting down when it shrinks, and for embroidery at the bottom on embroidered dresses, which is preferable to silk, as it keeps perfectly white when washed, and silk almost invariably turns yellow. The band may be made of satin jean, or twilled longcloth.

No. 13 to 15.—PATTERN FOR CHILD OF TWO OR THREE YEARS OF AGE.  
This pretty little frock will be seen in No. 11 on the other side of Supplement. It is suitable to be made in muslin or any other material; our model is of cotton, trimmed with linings of the same. 1 1/2 yards of cotton is required. The pocket is formed of a lining; stitches down at both edges, and a small flap placed over the lining.
