On motion of Mr. Benidickson, seconded by Mr. MacEachen, it was ordered,—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency praying that he will cause to be laid before this House a copy of all correspondence since January 1, 1962, between the Government of Canada and the Government of Ontario respecting a proposed 'road to resources' out from the Werner-Gordon Lakes nickel mining territory and referred to by the Minister of Northern Affairs and National Resources on February 28, 1962, *Hansard* page 1339.—(*Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 13*).
