

deemed necessary, for the purpose of vaccination, and shall take effectual means for giving from time to time to all persons resident in the city due notice of the days and hours and place or places at which the medical officer or such other medical practitioner as may be appointed for such purpose, will attend to vaccinate all persons who may then and there appear, and also of the days and hours at which such medical man will attend to inspect the progress of such vaccination in the persons so vaccinated.

Sec. 36.—A register shall be kept in such office, or each of such offices for the purpose of recording in an alphabetical order the names of each person vaccinated, date of such vaccination, age, residence, etc.

Sec. 37.—Every physician, who shall have any patient within the city limits, sick with small-pox, typhoid fever, diphtheria or other dangerous infectious disease, shall report the same to the said Board within the space of twenty-four hours, together with the name of such patient, and the street and the number of the house where such patient is treated.

Sec. 38.—The keeper of any hotel, boarding or public house, or the occupants of any dwelling house or other building in the said city, any inmate whereof shall be sick with small-pox, typhoid fever, diphtheria or other dangerous infectious disease, shall within the space of twenty-four hours after the said disease shall have made its appearance, report the same to the Board of Health.

Sec. 39.—When the Board of Health or its medical officers are of opinion on the certificate of their medical officer of health or of any other legally qualified medical practitioner, that the cleansing and the disinfecting of any house or part thereof, and of any articles therein,
