### TWENTY-TWO MINERS RELEASED FROM JAIL

#### Order From Ottawa Reaches British Columbia - Rioters in Okalla Penitentiary.

NEW WESTMINSTER, B.C., April 10.—Twenty-two Ladysmith miners, sentenced to varying terms in jail for participation in the riots on Vancouver Island last August, by Judge Howay, at Nanaimo, have been released from the Burnaby prison farm at Okalla, orders to that effect having reached the warden from the department of justice at Ottawa.

### FRANCE TO MAKE LOAN TO TURKEY

#### Certain Undisclosed "Economic Advantages" Are to Be Given in Return.

PARIS, April 10.—The French Government today signed an agreement according to a semi-official announcement. In return for the loan France is to be accorded certain economic advantages, the nature of which has not yet been disclosed. The amount of the new loan and the terms on which it is to be issued also have been kept secret.

### TONS OF HERRING THROWN OUT TO ROT

#### Port Arthur Plants Could Not Handle Great Catch of Fish.

PORT WILLIAM, April 10.—Flocks of gulls from the lake have been attracted by the fish thrown on the nuisance ground at Port Arthur and on a market garden nearby where the owner had hauled a lot of fish for fertilizer. So thick have the birds been during the winter and spring that the ground was almost white with them while they fed upon the fish.

### SOME SOLACE FOR FABRE.

PARIS, April 10.—Victor Fabre, the chief public prosecutor, who resigned office in consequence of his connection with the postponement of the trial of Henri Rochette, the man who is alleged to have carried out extensive swindles in France, was today appointed vice-president of the court of appeals at Aix-Les-Bains.
