THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL O.

An Act respecting The Northwest Life Assurance Company.

WHEREAS a petition has been presented praying that this Act be enacted as hereinafter set forth, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition: Therefore the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enact as follows:

1. Section 1 of chapter 104 of the Statutes of 1913 incorporating The Northwest Life Assurance Company is hereby amended by striking out the words "Robert Hamilton Fisher banker," and "Wilbert Jamieson Banker merchant," and inserting in their stead the words "Alexander Cunningham agent," and "Alexander Esch accountant."

2. Notwithstanding anything in section 75 of the Statutes of 1910 or in the Act chapter 104 of the Statutes of 1913, incorporating The Northwest Life Assurance Company, the said charter shall be deemed not to have expired and ceased to be in force after the sixth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, but to have continued and to be in force for all purposes whatsoever until the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and the Minister of Finance may at any time not later than the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and subject to all other provisions of the Statutes of 1910, grant to the said company the license necessary for carrying on business.

3. If the said company has not obtained the said license before the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, the said chapter 104 of the Statutes of 1913
