Bagration, Prince. Baldy, Lieutenant-General Sir David. Sent from England with expedition in 1805 to seize the Cape Colony, x, 93; On January 4, 1806, arrives at Table Bay, x, 93; On January 8, 1806, defeats the Dutch forces at Blueberg, x, 94; From January, 1806, to January, 1807, is at the head of the Cape government, x, 97.

Balboa, Vasco Nunez De. In 1513 discovers and names the Pacific Ocean, xiv, 11; The first to cross Central America, xiv, 101.

Bank of the United States. The first established by Hamilton, (1791), xx, 48, 49; Loses charter in 1811, xx, 137, 138; v, 64; The second bank chartered (1816), v, 82, 83; Bad management of it, v, 105, 106; Jackson's fight against it, v, 162-164, 166-169; Its recharter vetoed, xx, 303-305; Removal of deposits, xx, 310-315; The end of it, (1836), xx, 316; Clay's struggle to re-establish it, v, 191-193; National banking system established, (1863), v, 312.

Bantus. Clash in South Africa invade Capetown in 1770, x, 64; Again attack Capetown in 1780, x, 64; Peace is arranged with them in 1793 after another massacre of the colonists, x, 64; Chief Mosesh fixes his residence on Thaba Bosgo Mountain in 1824, x, 181; Chief Makoma driven over the Tyumla in 1829, x, 196; British expedition sent in 1840 to protect Bantu tribes against Dutch Colonists of Natal, x, 250; Missionaries are driven out of Bantu country in 1865, x, 378; South African forces make unsuccessful attempt in 1867 to subdue Bantu, x, 378.
