DISTRICT OF | General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, MONTREAL. April 30th, 1813.

HEREAS it has been represented to the Court that sundry persons calling themselves Ferrymen, undertake for hire, to pass people and effects over the Rivers, in different parts of this District, without licence, to the great detriment of the regular and licenced Ferrymen; and that those who have licences, neglect to renew them annually, so that the Magistrates cannot know the actual number of licenced Ferries effa-To prevent which in future,

It is hereby ordered and directed, that from and after the publication of this regulation, any person or persons who shall for hire, in the day time or in the night, ferry, or passany person or effects of any kind whatsoever, overany of the rivers in this District, whereon any regular licenced Ferries are established, without first having obtained a licence for that purpose, from the Court of Quarter Sessions, shall forfeit and pay, for every such offence, the fum of twenty shillings, such licence to be signed by the Clerk of the peace.

And it is further ordered and directed that all persons holding licences for Ferries in this District, or who may hereafter obtain fuch licence, shall renew the same at the Court of Quarter Sessions in the month of April of every year; and all and every person or persons who thall neglect to renew the fame accordingly, shall be considered to have given up their claim to renew such

That all licences obtained, or to be obtained for Ferries within this Diffrict, shall be in force until the first day of May, from and after the date thereof, and no

And in order to avoid the difficulties which may arise respecting the rates payable at the different Ferries by and for His Majesty's Troops, their wives, children and baggage, on their march through this District, it is hereby further ordered and directed,

That where any troops or parties upon command, have occasion to pass regular Ferries, it shall and may be lawful for the Commanding Officer either to pass over with his party as passengers, or to hire the ferry boat entirely to himself and his party, detaining others for that time, in his option; and in case he shall chuse to take passage for himself and party, as passengers, he shall only pay for himself and for each person, officer or soldier under his command, half of the ordinary rate payable by fingle persons, at any such Ferry; and in case he shall hire the Ferry boat for himself and party, he shall pay half of the ordinary rate for such boat or boats; and in fuch places where there are no regular Ferries, but that all persons hire boats at the rate they can agree for, officers, with or without parties, are to agree for boats at the rate as other persons do in like

Rules and Regulations, respecting Ferrymen, in and for the Distrct of Montreal.

151. E ACH and every licenced Ferrymen, on the River S1. Law-rence, and the grand (or Outlawa) River, shall be obliged to keep five able men in their service, two canoes, and one batteau, or Scow, Iwo feiting poles and three paddles for each cance, and four oars for each batteau or Scow, and shall be held and obliged to ferry over, day and night, without diffinction or partiality, all per-fons withing to crofs (when it can be done with fafety) each canoo shall be conducted by two men and each batteaux or Scow by at leaft three.

2d. Each and every Ferryman on every river other than the St. Lawrence and the Outlawas or grand River shall have and keep in his or their service three able men, one canoe and one batleaux or scow, and shall be held to conform themselves to every thing to which the ferry men on the St. Lawrence and Grand or Outlawas River are bound to, by the preceeding stricle.

3d. No Ferryman shall detain travellers more than one quarter

of an hour by day and one half hour by night.

411. Every Ferrymen shall be obliged to provide moveable plat-forms for the embarkation and landing of carriages, cattle, and other effects, which may be transported from one side of the river to the other, one of which shall be placed at the place of embarkation, and the other at that of debarkation.

5th. Whereas certain Ferryman, to the great prejudice ofothers, have made a practice of transporting travellers from the oppolite fide of the river to that where they refide, without having obtained a licence to that effect; it is ordered that each and every ferry-man shall abstain from that practice in future, under any pretext

whatever,

61. The Clerk of the peace shall give a copy of these regulations in English and French 10 every Ferrymen, together with copies in English and French of the Regulations of the 30th April, 1813, and each and every Ferrymen shall put up the same in some public part of his house, together with a copy of the 1 ariff of his licence, in English and French, and the Clerk of the Peace shall be to be forced for the Peace shall be to be to be the peace shall be the peace shall be to be the peace shall be the peace receive the fum of feven shillings and fix pence, for every certified copy of the Regulations and copy of the Tariff from every Ferrymen on the delivery thereof.

7th. The present regulations shall be in force during the whole lime of the navigation, and no Ferryman shall exact, receive, or demand from travellers, any greater price or fum of money for croffing them, than that which may and will be allowed them by the tate or toll annexed to their licence.

8th. Each and every Ferryman who shall infringe the present Regulations, or any part thereof, shall be liable to a fine of twenty shillings, for each and every offence.

9th. All Regulations respecting Ferrymen, previous to the 30th

April, 1813, are rescinded from this day.
