Receipts of live stock at the city market were large. The railways report a total of 132 car loads since Tuesday; composed of 2209 cattle, 1946 hogs, 2123 sheep, 61 calves and 3 horses. The C. P. R. had 39 cars, 634 cattle, 722 hogs, 1197 sheep, 37 calves, and the G. T. R. 93 cars, 1575 cattle, 1224 bogs, 926 sheep and 24 calves. Butchers' cattle were plentiful and very cheap. The bulk was of medium quality. A few good lots were offered and these were readily bought up, but the medium and common to inferior classes were slow of sale.
