132 CARLOADS AT CITY YARD TRADE WAS FAIRLY GOOD

Prices Were Generally Unchanged From the Quotations of Tuesday's Market.

Receipts of live stock at the city market were large. The railways report a total of 132 car loads since Tuesday, composed of 2200 cattle, 1045 hogs, 1129 sheep, 61 calves and 3 horses.

The quality of the bulk of the cattle was only medium, although there were several good lots.

The weather being exceptionally fine and many buyers from outside points, trade was fairly good, considering the heavy rain of the day.

Exporters. Few were offered, but plenty for the demand. One load was reported as having brought \$4.25. A few export hogs sold at \$3.25 to \$4 per cwt.

Butchers. Butchers' cattle were plentiful and very cheap. The bulk of the week's quality was readily bought up.

Feeders and Stockers. Deliveries of stock and feeders were large, and while buyers found it easier to get supplies, the market remained about the same.

Milk Cows. Considering the year, the deliveries of milk cows and springers were about the same.

Real Calves. The number offered was not large, but prices advanced to \$2.50 to \$3.50 per cwt.

Sheep and Lambs. There was a good demand as usual for sheep and lambs, which sold readily at prices ranging from \$1.50 to \$4.25 per cwt.

Hogs. The run of hogs was fairly large, 2200. Most of the week's quality was readily bought up.

Representative Sales. McDonald & Mayhew sold 24 butchers, 1100 lbs. each, at \$2.40 per cwt.

George Alderson bought for the Harris Bros. 700 lb. lot of 1000 lbs. each, which half were shipped direct from the country.
