He feels that he is the victim of an injustice, and his resentment is none the less because he can make no appeal from the price demanded. Whether local rates be reasonable or excessive there will be serious dissatisfaction as long as this discrimination exists. People feel they are denied privileges enjoyed by outsiders. It is the same with local and iong-distance for freight.
