FRANCHISE NOW GIVEN UP.

The Suburban Electric Railway Will Let the Toronto Railway Company Extend its Services

OVER DUNDAS TO KEELE STREET

In Return Toronto Junction Council Gives Up Certain Important Privileges—Public Opinion.

Toronto Junction, Sept. 3.—(Special.)—Mayor Langton, Town Solicitor (Gosnell) and Councilors (Anderson, Ryding and Paterson) returned from their visit to Montreal yesterday morning, where for two days they have been interviewing Mr. R. Wilson-Smith, president, and the directors of the Suburban Electric Railway, with a view to inducing the company to give up their right to the franchise, extending over Dundas-street to Keele-street.

The Agreement.

1. The Suburban Company consents to the Toronto Railway Company extending its services to the company of Keele and Dundas streets, thence along Keele-street to Humber-street, and then easterly along Humber-street to Dundas-street.

2. The company consents to extend its lines, at least ten (10) miles within five years.

3. In consideration of the above concessions the town will extend the present franchise for a term of years, on the same date as the Toronto Company's franchise, and will also abandon its right to mileage rental under the present agreement, and will extend the expiration of general taxation to the end of the term, and also will grant water at cost for ten years.

4. The town will maintain streets, and company to pay \$125 per mile per annum for such maintenance, commencing from the first day of January, 1900.

5. The town to grant a statutory franchise, once, and to promote legislation for ratification of agreement at company's cost.

6. In other respects the present form of printed draft agreement to be followed.

Public opinion is very much divided upon the result of the negotiations, the citizens in that portion of the town near where the city railway will run are generally satisfied.

A large portion of the business men are also satisfied; but there are others who look upon the proposed extension of the town as being open to question.

For instance, they point out that a belt line running about half a mile from the Junction, beginning and ending nowhere, can only benefit the citizens residing in the belt, or those who are extending the line, but will have a shorter distance to walk, and thus benefiting a few at the expense of adding a possible value to property south of Annette-street east of Keele-street, a comparatively small area.

The town also contains the provision in section 24, providing for absolute forfeiture in case the company does not keep up any line south of the Junction.

It is pointed out that, at all, abandonment of the franchise would be a benefit to the people who have built handsome residences in the quiet western part of the town are sacrificed in the matter of accommodation for the people in the east, who are already over-crowded.

WERE THROWN INTO THE SEA.

Two Sick Negroes Are Said to Have Been Fed to Sharks to Avoid Quarantine.

Antwerp, Sept. 2.—M. Mesdach de ter Kiele, Belgian Consul-General, has referred to the Criminal Court the case of the officers of the Belgian steamer Albertville, who are charged with having thrown overboard two negroes suffering from contagious disease, in order to avoid quarantine at Las Palmas, Canary Islands, on the way from Leopoldville to Antwerp.

The officers and crew of the vessel give strong evidence against the officers, saying that they saw the negroes clinging to the outside of two porpoises until their strength failed them, when they disappeared in the sea. The authorities cannot ascertain the whereabouts of the two negroes.

The affair is causing intense indignation in the vessel, although under Belgian registry, is mostly owned in Liverpool, and the captain and officers are English.

WELL BE MOST DEPLORABLE.

Threatened Strike of Seamen and Firemen Which Will Paralyze Commerce.

SHIP OWNERS IGNORE THE UNION

New White Star Liner Oceanic Could Not Get a Crew—Dominion and Cunarders Also Troubled.

London, Sept. 2.—This country is apparently on the eve of a sailors' and firemen's strike that will paralyze commerce, yet so far the matter has received only passing notice in the British press and has attracted practically no public interest.

The trouble arose over a manifesto to the ship owners, inviting them to confer on the question of fixing a rate for firemen and sailors on steamers of 26, and for sailors on sailing ships of 44 monthly, a slight advance in the average wages now paid at the various British ports. The ship owners utterly ignored the union, with the result that the latter have planned a strike at every port of the United Kingdom, to commence next Monday.

Mr. Joseph Havelock Wilson, member of Parliament for Middleborough, a Radical, but who was elected more particularly as a labor representative, has been addressing meetings at Liverpool, Bristol, Newcastle and Glasgow.

The Liverpool cooks, it is said, have joined forces with the seamen, but the wage issue is now rather secondary to the recognition of the union by the ship owners. Any offer to negotiate by the latter would probably defer and perhaps prevent the strike. The men claim that though the shipping trade has improved the workers' condition has remained stationary.

Already the force of the strike movement is beginning to be felt. Fearing that it would be impossible to have the men sail, the White Star Line Steamship Company decided to have the men sail on Thursday last, but the latter refused in a body to do so, and the result was that the steamer Cambrian and the Cunard Line steamer Sylvania met with a similar experience at Liverpool, in official of the Firemen's Union is quoted as saying he believes the strike was inevitable, but thought it would only last for a week, the ship owners then being compelled to act at least.
