The Serving of Wines. A recent writer on affairs pertaining to the table bewalls the fact that few housewives, even in homes where liquor is served, know anything about the proper method of handling wines.

All wine buttles, he explains, should be kept on their sides. This is especially necessary with sparkling wines.

Part, Burgundy and Madeira must be decanted very carefully and slowly and post should be strained thru cambric.

Sherry should be decanted an hour before using hit claret should not be taken thod of handling wines. fore using, but claret should not be taken fore using, but claret should not be taken from the bottle until it is to be used.

The white wines should be very cold, claret less cold, port and herry warmest of all, while champagne must be placed in an ice cooler before use.

Beer and ale must be kept in a dry place and never allowed to stand in a draught. The bottles should stand with the cork up and be served at a temperature of 55 degrees. By following even these few hints, says the authority, women could make the liquor they serve much more palatable.
