CAUSE OF STRIKERS' RIGHT

Coal Barons Will Be Held Responsible for Much Misery in the Hills of Pennsylvania.

SERMON BY REV. JAMES L. GORDON

"Coal at \$10 a Ton" Paraphrases Text for Discourse in Bond-Street Church.

Rev. James L. Gordon, in the course of his remarks at Bond-Street Congregational Church Sunday night, came out strongly in favor of the cause of the striking coal miners, and announced his deep faith in the justice of organized labor and the integrity of labor leaders.

So far back as man can remember, or so he said, the world has had to deal with similar problems to those that demand attention now. There were imperfections to be found both on the side of capital and of labor, so long as a difficulty between them was not in one's immediate neighborhood, little attention was given to it, but as soon as it enters by way of the door and gets into one's own cellar it commands respect.

In Cases of Corporations. Concerning the coal strike, there was not a thoughtful man anywhere who would say that the cause of the present embarrassment of the coal industry is in the grasp of the large commercial corporations of the day.

Continuing, he said it was impossible for a man to live on the pittance of \$300 a year, and that the coal miners were right. Labor leaders were great, but they were not the cause of the trouble.

In conclusion, Mr. Gordon advanced these ideas: that all men are not born equal; that the law is not always just; that it is unreasonable to expect a man to have a right to work for whom he will, and to try and forcibly prevent a man from taking any position he desires in anarchy and despotism.

Turkish Atrocities Reproduce the Crisis of Twenty-Five Years Ago.

PLAIN TALK TO SULTAN OF TURKEY

Russia and Austria Lay Plans to Deal With the Grave Situation.

London, Sept. 28.—Public utterances regarding the approaching crisis in Turkey and the Balkans are becoming more outspoken. Russians and Bulgarians will celebrate with great éclat in the next few days the emancipation of Bulgaria from the Turkish yoke of Sultan Abdul Hamid.

It is plain language which was used in the semi-official Novoye Vremya yesterday, when it said: "Turkey, twenty-five years ago, was weak by the aid made to bite the dust, and which, once crippled and exhausted, has now recovered its strength, with Europe as brought about the downfall of the Constantinople conference."

"However Turkey may try to deceive Europe as to the true state of affairs, it is under way in progress in the Balkans, and all eyes are turned to the Balkans, where no good for the near future is to be seen."

J. J. HILL ON BIG TRUSTS.

Beware, He Says, of Those Running Printing Presses Only.

St. Paul, Minn., Sept. 28.—"Many people are apprehensive of the great industrial enterprises which are being carried on in this country, and well they may be, for there are so-called industrial enterprises whose only industry is running printing presses to print shares of stock."

This spoke James J. Hill, president of the Great Northern Railway and Northern Securities Company, before a group of people at the Grant County Fair at Eagle Lake, Minn., on Saturday.

"When you put them all together there is no harm in the entire mass," continued President Hill; "but if the object is to get something for nothing—to get something that does not belong to them—to get money out of another man's pocket, the object has been worked for, and put into the hands of the few—if that is the object, then it is all wrong. But some of these great enterprises are absolutely sound and working—some people advocate, and our President advocates, turning everything over to Congress. What kind of a Congress would we have after a while if all the business of the country were turned over to it? I think they would do better business in the halls of Congress, but the business they would do would not bring the business to you that you want."

"I think I should hold every man responsible for himself and his own acts. If he does wrong, punish him; if he does right, protect him. When that is done those questions will take care of themselves."
