## PARKDALE COLLEGIATE WINS CHAMPIONSHIP

Of the Interscholastic Games—  
Edwards is Individual Champion  
—Three Records Broken.

The sixth annual interscholastic games were run off yesterday at Varsity Athletics Field, before some 2500 spectators, who were favored by perfect weather, and also witnessed some splendid sport, in which Parkdale easily captured the championship, with 46 points. Northwestern was second, with 32 points, while Jarvis and Riverside were tied for third, with 20 points. Brampton, who made their initial appearance, were next, tied with Woodstock, with 9 points.

Galt, who won the championship last year, were not represented this time, while Hurdston, who have always been strong contenders in years gone by, did not receive a point yesterday.

Edwards of Parkdale won the individual championship, while three records were broken and one equalled. Edwards captured one-fifth of a second off the 100-yard record, held by Halbhais, while in the 220 yards Edwards equaled the record, held by Seibert. Campbell of Woodstock College broke the running high jump record by three-quarters of an inch, while in the 120 yard hurdles McEachern of Northwestern beat the record, held by Croesen, by one-fifth of a second.
