CITY TO SPEND \$83,925 IN CHARITABLE GRANTS

Amount is \$15,550 Greater Than in 1908—House of Industry Gets \$35,000. The city's grand total charitable institutions during 1909 will amount to \$83,925, as against \$68,375 expended last year, an increase of \$15,550.

British Ship Owners Kick. Object to Canada's Regulating of Bills of Lading Form. (Canadian Associated Press Cable.) LONDON, Feb. 23.—At a meeting of the Liverpool Shipowners' Association Chairman Fernie said the various colonial legislatures now thought it time to take a hand in harassing and worrying them as much as they could, and referred to a bill introduced in the Canadian Parliament, which had since been withdrawn, but which might be reintroduced, to regulate the form of bills of lading, which would entirely have done away with the freedom of contract between shippers and shipowners.

In Railway Committee. Alberta Central Gets Time Extended—Fort William Station. OTTAWA, Feb. 23.—The commons railway committee this morning reported a bill to extend the time for the building of the Alberta Central Railway, and to allow the company to build an extra 400 miles from its proposed western terminus to the line of the G. T. P. at Yellowhead Pass, and from the eastern end on to Saskatoon, also to increase the capacity to two million, and the bonding powers to \$25,000 per mile.

Hotelman Hits Back. OTTAWA, Feb. 23.—Adolphus Charon, the licensee who was on Saturday at Hull allowed to go on a charge of selling liquor to a minor, has taken out a summons against the minor, Emil Hemond. The evidence showed that Hemond, when he demanded drink gave his age as 19, and a man accompanying him said he was 18, whereas he was barely 17. Charon charges Hemond with giving his age as over 18 when asking for liquor. The summons is returnable on Feb. 25.
