FOREIGN EXCHANGE IS STIFFER, BUT STOCKS ARE STEADY

Greater Firmness in Money Offsets Recovery in International Credits—Downward Trend of Commodity Prices Viewed With Satisfaction in Wall Street.

New York, Feb. 5.—Although the foreign exchange situation, as applied to London and Paris, showed moderate improvement today, the stock market continued under incessant pressure on renewed selling for both accounts.

The recovery in international credits was nullified as a market factor by greater firmness of money call loans and advancing from the high renewal rate of 17 per cent to 20, with stronger tendencies to bank acceptances and commercial paper.

Many stocks, including United States Steel, which fell a fraction yesterday, were lower by 1 to 2 points from yesterday's extreme reactions, losses applying in almost every class of high-grade and minor issues.

With around 1000 cattle on the exchange yesterday the market was decidedly better than the previous day, but it was not as good as to purchases of any class.
