CONFERENCE FOR A CHEAP CABLE RATE

If Old Companies Will Not Come Down to a Penny a Word Lemux may Pledge Canada to Help Lay New Line.

Ottawa, Nov. 9.—Much interest is manifested here in the outcome of the cable conference which opens tomorrow in London under the auspices of the Royal Colonial Institute.

It is said that Hon. Mr. Lemux has a card up his sleeve which when played will make the companies sit up and think. It is no other than a proposition for laying of a new Atlantic cable at the joint expense of Canada and Great Britain.

The cost would not exceed \$2,000,000 and could be made to pay working expenses besides interest, sinking fund and renewal charges at a rate of five cents a word for ordinary messages and two cents a word for press dispatches.

Without any intention of shooting game the father had taken his rifle along but in a rough piece of woods, about five miles from Henry Creek, he stumbled and fell. The rifle was discharged, the bullet penetrating the boy's side, causing instant death.

The body arrived here at 4 o'clock this morning accompanied by the heart-broken parents. The deceased was fourteen years old.

New York, Nov. 9.—The government's contention that the American Tobacco Company is a trust operating in restraint of trade in violation of the Sherman anti-trust law, was sustained in decisions handed down Saturday by Judges Lacombe, Cox, Noyes and Ward in the United States circuit court here.

The government's complaint against the tobacco trust must be sustained. Judge Lacombe said that a receiver, which had been requested was impracticable and unnecessary. Judge Lacombe ordered that the issuance of an injunction restraining the various tobacco companies from doing business should be suspended until after decision on an appeal.

HAS NOT REACHED TROUSSEAU STAGE

Senator Elkins' Daughter and the Duke of the Abruzzi are not Yet Betrothed.

Elkins, W. Va., Nov. 9.—While increased interest seems lately to have centered in the reported engagement of Miss Katherine Elkins, daughter of United States Senator Stephen B. Elkins, and the Duke of the Abruzzi, it is declared here today in circles close to the Elkins household that there has been no change in the status of affairs during the last several months and that no definite announcement of any sort is to be expected in the very near future.

There is absolutely no disposition here to deny the strong attachment that exists between the young Italian nobleman and Miss Elkins, but that the affair has approached the trousseau stage is nowhere admitted. It is further pointed out that if there ever should be a formal announcement it would come, according to court etiquette, in an official statement from Rome.

There are so many considerations entering into a proposed marriage of this sort aside from the personal wishes of the young people involved that even Miss Elkins' closest friends here are not discussing the matter with a view to early eventuality, while that young lady herself, a typical and loyal American girl, in all her views and mode of life, is enjoying herself in boyish sports and games into the mountains amongst her brothers, who no more enthusiastic than she over the joys of out-of-doors.

The many unauthorized and speculative stories that have been printed regarding the affair have been very annoying to Senator Elkins and the members of his family. This was especially true of the report that a morganatic marriage had been contemplated.

It is declared that there never has been the slightest intimation of such an arrangement and non would be considered for a moment. The report that Miss Elkins had ordered a trousseau is declared to be without the slightest foundation. It is also declared that talk of a special dowry is entirely erroneous, and that such a subject has never been broached.

It is finally stated that correspondence between Miss Elkins and the Duke has been confined solely to the Duke and Miss Elkins herself. This being the case, it is possible that the Duke has been in the city, but has not only been erroneous, but unjust to the people.

CHARLES V. MORSE NOW CLAIMS HE IS UNABLE TO PAY HIS BILLS

Former Ice King, Who Two Years Ago Was Rated as Worth Upwards of \$20,000,000, is Now Impoverished—Judge Reserves Decision on Application for Bail.

New York, N. Y., Nov. 9.—Charles W. Morse, who two years ago, was rated as being worth upwards of \$20,000,000 today swore under oath that he had not enough money or securities left from his vast fortune to pay his debts.

This revelation was made when Morse's attorneys appeared in the United States circuit court of appeals to argue for the admission of Morse to bail. Morse, who has been sentenced to hard labor in the federal prison at Atlanta, Ga., was not permitted to leave the prison today, but an affidavit was filed by his attorneys.

It had not been expected that Morse would make the plea that he was a bankrupt, as ever since the financial panic, which swept away the greater part of his fortune, he has maintained that he would be able to satisfy his creditors to the satisfaction of all creditors and judges.

In referring to the sentence imposed upon Morse, Lawyer MacFarlane termed it "ruthless and almost unprecedented."

Wallace MacFarlane appeared in court on behalf of Morse and argued on the opinion of Judge Hough in refusing to grant bail in which Judge Hough said that no amount of bail would be sufficient to secure the appearance in court of such a wealthy man as Morse, when he was wanted. Mr. MacFarlane then continued:

The lawyer called attention to the fact that when Morse was indicted, he was on his way to Europe, but that he came immediately back to this country upon learning of his indictment.
